Dear praying friend,

Last week, while studying for one of my personal broadcasts on Teaching Faithful Men, the Lord focused my attention on Acts 6:4, "But we will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the word." The Apostles became distracted by good and necessary things from their most important duties. They recruited seven men to take care of practical matters so that they could concentrate on prayer and the ministry of the Word. God's blessing was soon evident to all (Acts 6:7)! Prayer is our communication with God. The Word is God's communication to us. By focusing on these two pillars of the ministry, the staff at the Harbour Light can maintain close fellowship with God and see the power of God in the work. The staff gathers Monday through Friday at 11:30 AM to pray and to seek God. Please join the effort!

One of the current potential distractions from the work is the cost of fuel and the resulting drain on the station's finances. Many of us in the States marvel at how often the price of gas fluctuates. The government controls the price of fuel in Grenada. Changes are much less frequent but just as real. For most of this year, the price of diesel has been \$3.45 per US gallon. As of August 1, 2007, the price increased to about \$3.75 per US gallon. This change will result in an additional \$3,000 per year in fuel costs. Fuel represents about 36% of the Harbour Light's cost of operation. Pray that the Lord would supply and that the financial issues will not be a distraction to the work.

Another facet of the ministry facing potential distractions is Harbour Light Christian Academy. The school will be able to use the current facilities for one more school year, which is a tremendous blessing. However, the owner of one of the buildings plans to return to Carriacou the following year and the school will need a building. The government may soon grant HLCA the ability to issue the equivalent of a high school diploma. Grenadian nationals are expressing interest in sending their children to the school. HLCA could see an increase in enrollment at the same time as needing school facilities. One solution is to build a school on the radio station property. Pray for wisdom and direction.

The Murphy's and Steel's continue on the deputation trail. Both are at about 50% of their needed support. Either would enjoy presenting their ministry to your church or school.
